5th Grade Science

5th Grade ELA

In fifth grade ELA, students will be using the Units of Study Reading and Writing Workshops to deepen skills and open horizons of learning. The workshops allow students to read diverse books and write on a multitude of subjects and formats. We will use building blocks from previous years to strengthen abilities and improve weaknesses. We will use a flipped classroom to do the workshop. Students will be expected to watch videos that will help them understand the new skill or strategy that will be practiced at home or in school. We will also learn many new vocabulary words throughout the year, so when they read more challenging books they can identify new words, opening the door to the next level of reading.

ReadingPlus, News ELA, and IXL will be utilized as well. Students may schedule individual chat sessions with ELA teachers on Fridays or they may be required to attend a live session on Friday. Our Google Classroom will be updated frequently with class assignments and weekly checklists.
