We will prioritize time for long term project work as well as assessments. Certain projects could lend themselves to props, etc from home but those aren't conversations that have happened yet. I don't know how that will look in the context of this school year. I have a vision for a consistent routine for kids, but please understand everything is fluid at this point.

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## **8th Grade Math & Algebra I**

8th Grade Math and Algebra I will be taught using a flipped mastery approach. Flipped mastery is an instructional practice where students receive information through a video lesson at home, then practice and explore using their new knowledge in class. At the end of each lesson, when students have completed all portions of the lesson, students will take an exit ticket to demonstrate mastery of the lesson. Students are able to move at their own pace as long as they meet the dates in the pacing guide. We have decided to use the flipped mastery approach to enable us more time in class to work individually with our students, to allow opportunities for application and deep learning activities, and to help develop a sense of ownership of learning in our students. General guidelines and pacing will be given for the nine weeks in the syllabus, but hopefully this gives you an overview of what to expect this year. Be on the lookout each Friday for the post of the pacing guide for the following week.
